

THE ORIGIN OF THE DOLLAR SIGN

EVER WONDER WHY the dollar sign is basically the letter 'S' with a line (or sometimes a double line) through it? To find out, we have to travel back to 16th century Mexico, Peru and Bolivia. It was during this time that massive amounts of

silver was found by the Spanish (who had just conquered South America). There was so much silver, they began making coins out of it, coins which would come to be known as "pesos."

Because the word "pesos" was too much of a hassle for merchants of the time to write out over and over again when they would list items for sale, they would shorten it with a letter "P" and "S." Over time, the P and S eventually overlapped. Most history buffs agree that the evolution of the dollar sign probably went something like this:





Soon after, in the 1700's, the \$ symbol began being used up to the north, in what would become the United States of America. And here we are, almost 250 years later, and the dollar sign is one of the most iconic symbols in the world.

HERE'S WHY DOLLARS ARE CALLED "DOLLARS!" Wayyyy back in 1519, a small town in central Europe (located in what is known as the Czech Republic today) created its own silver coins. These coins were called "talergroschen." That name was much too long and clunky to say, so it was eventually shortened to "talers" (pronounced like "tallers"). This spread across Europe and made its way to America, where the pronunciation of the word was softened to "dollars." And the rest is history!

NINA OTERO-WARREN

Nina Otero-Warren was a leader in New Mexico's suffrage movement, which worked to ensure that women had the right to vote in elections. She was also the first-ever female superintendent of schools. Next to her image on the coin are three Yucca flowers - New Mexico's state flower.



ANNA MAY WONG

Anna May Wong was the first Chinese American film star in Hollywood. She appeared in more than 60 movies, and also did television and stage work. She enjoyed international fame in a time when that was very rare for Asian actors.
